

REMINGTON MEDICAL RESORT BREAKS GROUND IN MEDICAL CENTER

The corner of Babcock and Hamilton Wolfe Road in San Antonio is the site for a new transitional care medical resort unlike any in the nation.

“We are introducing a new option for people coming out of a hospital after surgery or illness,” said Todd Mackenzie, CEO of Remington Medical Resort – San Antonio.

“Once patients register as our guests, our skilled medical and rehabilitation teams will partner with each guest to plan a personal treatment regimen. The resort will provide a unique opportunity for guests to recuperate in an upscale setting,”

“Within the medical community, transitional care is not a new concept,” explains Ken Morgan, President of Remington Medical Resorts.

“Many patients require further medical care or rehabilitation before going home, but are well enough to leave the hospital. No matter how comfortable, traditional long-term care facilities don’t appeal to patients in need of only a few days or weeks of transitional care,” Morgan continues. “We’re building Remington to focus on short-term, post-acute care only.”

The management team of Remington Medical Resorts believes that its brand of professionalism, luxury, therapy and service is just what San Antonio doctors and patients will choose after hospital discharge.

Designed by Mayse & Associates of Dallas, the \$10 million dollar, 48,000 square foot medical resort will have 60 private guest suites, each complete with private shower, refrigerator, flat-screen television, cable, and desk with wired and wireless Internet. Guests may spend time in areas such as the library, living room with fireplace, Internet café, and coffee shop. Gourmet meals prepared by an executive chef may be ordered in the dining room, or called in by the guest for in-room dining service. As a final indulgence, guests may treat themselves to massages, manicures or facials on site.

Recruiting exceptional medical professionals and implementation of a high nurse/guest ratio are among Remington’s key strategies to medical success, says Mackenzie. “We’ll see guests recovering from hip or joint replacement, stroke, heart and pulmonary disease, the whole gamut, even routine plastic and cosmetic surgery. We’ll be prepared to treat each medical challenge comprehensively, and serve each guest individually.”

The resort will include two fully equipped rehabilitation gyms and a rehabilitation pool for aquatic therapy, with an underwater treadmill, camera and monitors. These facilities will be especially helpful after orthopedic surgery or joint replacement, allowing for therapy in a non-weight bearing environment.

Despite Remington’s high-end medical facilities and resort style amenities, costs will be comparable to skilled inpatient facilities. Payment options include Medicare, insurance and private pay.

“Affordable, attractive and effective, this transitional care concept of short-term recovery provided in a resort setting is the first of its kind in the nation,” said Mackenzie “We look forward to working with area hospitals, physicians, medical professionals and the community.” He added, “I can’t imagine a better place than San Antonio, Texas to build a dream into a reality,”

Remington Medical Resort - San Antonio is scheduled to break ground in March and open for guests in late Fall of this year. Other resorts are slated to follow in the Dallas, Houston, Austin and Denver areas.
